If you've been involved in a church for long, you've heard all about Jesus - things he taught, what he expects from you, and his death on a cross. But who is he really? The Gospel of Mark is a fast-paced account of Jesus' life concerned with answering this very question: who is this guy? Over the weeks leading up to Easter, we'll see that Jesus is Master, Teacher, Son of God, Compassionate Servant, Messiah, King, our Sacrifice, and our Savior. This winter/spring, youth groups will meet together on Sunday evenings from 6-7:30 to walk through the sixteen chapters of Mark's gospel and



encounter Jesus on the move.

This month, Northwest will send care packages to college students and military personnel who were involved in the youth ministry here during high school and/or consider Northwest their home church. These packages will be assembled and mailed the week after Easter to ensure that they arrive in time for final exams. There are a few ways you can help:
